#### NATIONAL HOUSING CO-OPERATIVE NETWORK INITIATED

Co-operation Housing has joined forces with WA's
Federation of Housing Collectives (FOHCOL), Common
Equity NSW and Common Equity Housing Ltd (Victoria)
to form the new National Housing Co-operative Network.

With each group supporting common-equity rental housing co-operatives in its respective state, the network has already begun holding regular teleconferences to share ideas, pool information and start jointly tackling common challenges.

OPENING DOORS

The National Housing Conference is the largest cross-sector meeting focusing on affordable housing delivery in Australasia.

This year's conference, titled 'Opening Doors', will be held in Perth from 28 to 30 October.



### SPEAKING UP FOR THE CO-OPERATIVE MODEL

Senate Inquiry into the role of co-ops,
mutual and member-owned firms in the
Australian economy. Co-operation Housing
made a submission on behalf of its members and of the WA
housing co-operative sector as a whole.

The inquiry committee is due to report by 30 November 2015.
